This term, the children have got to know new friends, learnt the rules and routines of being at school at Sandy Hill Academy, and flourished in their new learning environment. A huge moment for many children has been beginning to segment and blend words to read them, and getting their very first phonic reading book. The children have continued to show interest and enthusiasm for phonics, and learning new sounds. We have encouraged the love of reading through stories and song, and learning rhymes during the recent 'Nursery Rhyme Week'.

We have been working on our play skills, and have enjoyed our weekly 'We Thinkers' sessions, where we have been learning to talk about our feelings, and think about how we move our bodies, including thinking before we react.

In English, we have worked on handwriting alongside enjoying using Spelling Shed to learn the weekly spellings. The children have written descriptions, instructions and biography's all linked to our history topic of The Romans Vs The Celts. In maths, each child has enjoyed placing themselves on the TTRockstars leader board in preparation for the Multiplication Check coming up in June. We have also focused on place value, addition and subtraction, area and multiplication and division. In science lessons, the children have loved taking part in experiments linked to our topics of electricity and sound. A particular highlight was making our own torches out of pringle tubes! Computing lessons have been focused around staying safe online as well as honing fundamental keyboard skills which will be essential for accessing the computing curriculum as we move through KS2. In geography, we have learnt all about sustainability and this will be great knowledge to bring into our next topic, The Amazon Rainforest! We have been lucky enough to be involved in the cross country event at Poltair school as well as our enjoyable trip to the cinema. We are looking forward to many more events to come in the new year (such as learning how to play the ukulele!) and hope you have a brilliant Christmas with your loved ones.

Year 6 has been buzzing with activity this term! We delved into our World War Two topic, diving into stories like "Carrie's War" and exploring themes of resilience through the poem "Invictus." Ending the term with "Letters from the Lighthouse," we've been captivated by these tales.

In Maths, we worked incredibly hard during our daily arithmetic, seeing our scores soar each week. Plus, we tackled place value, the four operations, and fractions. Art became an adventure in drawing techniques, inspired by war themes and the works of artist Cherry Crawford. We even got crafty in DT, using our textile skills to create comforting pillows from old materials. Geography broadened our understanding of fair trade, while in History, we delved deep into World War 2—debating Britain's entry, evacuations, the Blitz, and coping strategies. Computing taught us internet safety and web creation, and Science took us on a journey from exploring blood to experimenting with electricity, building circuits and solving puzzling problems. Trips added excitement to our learning: from a Kernow King workshop at the

library to cinema outings and an inspiring day at Plymouth University learning about exciting courses and career paths. Year 6 has been a whirlwind of learning and adventures!

COMMUNICATION & INTERACTION - MAKATON

Makaton is a unique language programme that uses symbols, signs and speech to enable to communicate. Being able to communicate is one of the most important skills we need in live. Almost everything we do involves communication! Makaton uses signs along with speech in spoken word order to help provide extra clues about what someone is saying. It can help people with no speech or whose speech is unclear. Using symbols can help people who have limited speech and those who cannot, or prefer not to sign.

We are so proud of Mrs Facey who has successfully completed her Makaton Tutor training following lots of hard work and study over the last few years. Mrs Facey already runs the after school Makaton club with Mrs Whetter, and is leading the development of Makaton use through Early Years and beyond!

Attendance



Attending school regularly is so important, both academically and socially. We believe that children need to be in school for all sessions so that they can make the most progress possible. Children who are absent from school,

- miss vital learning,
- miss their friends,
- can find it difficult to catch up when they return to school.

Catching up an absent child can also affect others in the class, as adults time has to be spent on one child.

We recognise that there are occasions when it is appropriate to authorise an absence, such as when a pupil is genuinely too ill to attend school, has a medical appointment that cannot be taken outside of school hours or a request for leave has been agreed in exceptional circumstances.

However, the Government does not support parents taking children out of school unless the school agrees this is appropriate under 'exceptional circumstances. Any request for leave should be made in writing to the Head of School using the school's request form.

Subject to the guidance below, we may apply for a penalty notice for unauthorised leave:

If your child is absent from school without authorisation, you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996. We may submit a request to Cornwall Council for a Penalty Notice to be issued, in accordance with Sections 444A and 444B of the said Act. Penalty Notices are issued per liable parent, per child and each carry a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice may result in legal action. Absence not authorised by the school may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates' Court under Section 444(1) or Section 444(1A) of the Education Act 1996, leading to a fine of up to £2,500 and/or a custodial sentence. Cornwall Council may also apply for the costs incurred in taking the matter to Court.
