Ongoing:

Exploring and developing ideas: Record and explore ideas from first hand observation, experience and imagination.

Ask and answer questions about the starting points for work and develop ideas.

Explore the differences and similarities within the work of artists, crafts people and designers in different times and cultures and making links to their own work.

Evaluating and developing work: Review what they and others have done and say what they think and feel about it. E.g. Annotate sketch book using language of art, craft and design.

Identify what they might change in their current work or develop in their future work.
